

- 1. Based on my conversation with members of the Vermont State Police Computer Crimes Unit, who have experience and training in the area of computer forensics, I have learned the following information in relation to searches of computers and computer-related equipment:
  - a. Evidence seized from computers almost always requires agents to seize most or all of the electronic storage devices to be searched later by a qualified computer expert in a laboratory or other controlled environment. This is because when a user wants to conceal criminal evidence, he/she can store it in random order with deceptive file names. This requires searching authorities to examine all stored data to determine which particular files are included in the warrant. This sorting process can take weeks or months, depending on the volume of data stored, and is best accomplished in a laboratory or other controlled environment. It is impractical to attempt to retrieve this kind of data on site.
  - b. Searching computer systems for criminal evidence is a highly technical process requiring expert skill and a properly controlled environment. The vast array of computer hardware and software available requires even computer experts to specialize in some systems and applications, so it is difficult to know before a search which expert should analyze the system and its data. The search of a computer system is an exacting scientific procedure, which is designed to protect the integrity of the evidence and to recover even "hidden," erased, compressed, password- protected, or encrypted files. Since computer evidence is vulnerable to tampering or destruction (both from external sources or from destructive codes imbedded in the system as a "booby trap"), the controlled environment of a laboratory is important to its complete and accurate analysis.
  - c. In order to fully retrieve data from a computer system, the analyst needs all magnetic storage devices as well as the central processing unit (CPU). In addition, the analyst needs all the computer software, including system software (operating systems or interfaces, and hardware drivers) and any application software, which may have been used to create the data (whether stored on hard drives or on external media).
  - d. Computer software is digital information, which can be interpreted by a computer and any of its related components to direct the way they work. Software is stored in electronic magnetic, optical, or other digital form, and it commonly includes programs to run operating systems, applications (like word processing, graphics, or spreadsheet program), utilities, compilers, interpreters, and communication programs.
  - e. Computer-related documentation consists of written, recorded, printed, or electronically stored material, which explains or illustrates how to configure or use computer hardware, software, or other related items.
  - f. Computer hardware-software, documentation, passwords and security devices may be important to a criminal investigation in two distinct and important respects: (1) the objects themselves may be instrumentalities, fruits or evidence of a crime and/or (2) the objects may have been used to collect and store information about crimes in the form of electronic data.
  - g. Searching computerized information for evidence or instrumentalities of crime commonly requires agents to seize most or all of a computer system's input/output peripheral

devices, storage media, related software, documentation, and data security devices (including passwords) so that a qualified computer expert can accurately retrieve the system's data in a laboratory or other controlled environment. The peripheral devices which allow users to enter or retrieve data from the storage devices vary widely in their compatibility with other hardware and software. Many system storage devices require particular input/output (or "I/O") devices in order to read the data on the system. It is important that the analyst be able to properly reconfigure the system as it now operates in order to accurately retrieve the evidence listed above.

- h. Because of the complexities of computer systems, it is useful for the computer analyst to have ready access after the seizure to any storage media, containing relevant material. In a typical case, the analyst will make a mirror image of the original storage media. In order to preserve the evidence as carefully as possible, it is preferable for the government to maintain the complete original storage media in its entirety, even if it contains information not specified in the warrant.
- i. The process of completing a search and analysis of a seized computer often takes longer than 10 days and may take months to complete.
- 12. Based on the foregoing facts and information, this Affiant has probable cause to believe that the evidence of Vandalism, Unlawful Mischief will be found.

Federal Task Force has already contacted us. We advised that their agency normally investigates these types of crimes, however, if we knew that whoever did this did not have any intent for this to be a Hate Crime and that it was like thinks, "a drunk kid that did something stupid", and we knew that was the offender's only motivation, then VSP could potentially charge it as a vandalism. We advised them that if they heard anything, such as any names, to give us a call and we would follow up on any lead. We advised that if we could talk to the person responsible and get out ahead of the Federal agency taking it over, then we may be able to charge it as a simple vandalism, but without being able to talk to the person(s) responsible, we don't know what their intent is/was. Again, prior to clearing from this location, we advised them to call us and leave us a voicemail if they wanted, they didn't even have to leave their name if they didn't want to, just the information they wanted to pass along to us, should they hear anything.
