Discussion notes:

- Not every book is for every person. It's ok to put a book down if it's not for you. It is not ok for one person to have the right to take it away from everyone.
- This would be the first time a book has been reconsidered in this district.
- No one has filed a reconsideration about this book yet.
- Harm was caused when the book was criticized for being inappropriate
- We have other books in the EHS library that discuss
- The article relates sexual identity to porn
- A teacher stated that students in her class have chosen to read this book and have enjoyed it and requested it at times.
- Students are surprised when books are banned Teacher account from a classroom discussion
- There are other books in the library that center cis heteronormativity and no one takes that
- A statement of support from the district could be validating and hopeful to the community

## Next Steps

- 1. Team discusses next steps after listening to scenario:
- Can the district come out with a statement in support of LGBTQIA+ students and community members?
- Support of the district and school are helpful for Librarians as they fight back against censorship and persecution
- We should make sure we support all year around so our LGBTQIA+ community feels supported
- Display in the library for gender queer books
- Fix up one heart bulletin board to show student body that we support them
- Anonymous support from other students student voice google form use harmful questions as teaching experiences, take good questions and use them as conversation starters in Advisory
- Conversation starter in advisory creative way to discuss this in a non harmful way
- Use this as an opportunity to teach empathy and the importance of community through Advisory slides and circles circles can be during Advisory or other classes (maybe Porchea could lead circles with a student?)
- Advisory slides to show support for LGBTQIA+ (Transgender awareness week Nov. 15-19)
- Transgender awareness week is next week Nov 15-19 One heart will be doing some things during this week
- Planned parenthood peer educators can set up table outside of the cafeteria (EHS use to have this pre covid)
- What would feel valuable to people of the trans and Asexual experience?
- Stonewall institute for ideas sometimes they have great information there
- Everyone has the right to access the information they want
- Fly pride flag could be an SJU project. A project for allies to put themselves in front for our LGBTQIA+ community members

#### Scenario

There is a book in our library called "Gender Queer" (added 2019). A parent has called the police and cited Vermont Law. The police chief sent the issue to the State's Attorney. There is an article in <u>Vermont Daily about the book</u> being in the EHS Library.

The book contains 3 sexually explicit pages, while the rest is critical information for LBGTQIA+ youth. There are books in our library with similar content but about young people in hetero cis relationships. These books have not been questioned.

The book won the <u>NJ Garden State Teen Book Award for grades 6-12</u>. It received good reviews from Publishers Weekly and School Library Journal and is recommended for classrooms by Publishers Weekly.

The librarians may have a panel if anyone requests a book to be removed. They have policy and procedure to prevent book banning.
