

Moreover, the Court notes that inscribing concrete or paved surfaces with chalk is highly evanescent, and likely to disappear within a few hours of its application. Nothing about the alleged conduct rises to the level of disorderly conduct, as that is usually understood to involve upset, annoyance or inconvenience to innocent passersby or reasonable persons.

Finally, it is hard to imagine a municipality bringing its full weight and majesty to bear on schoolchildren, innocently drawing flowers or hop-scotch squares on a public parking lot or sidewalk. Surely any city, town or municipality has far more pressing concerns. Regardless of the age of the sidewalk artist, and assuming that the content is not obscene, profane, insulting or inciteful of violence, the act of drawing sayings or pictures on the public sidewalks with chalk does not constitute disorderly conduct, either under Newport's Ordinance 95, or the State statutes. 13 V.S.A. §1026.

In a Court with pending felonies and serious misdemeanors involving injury to others, the Presiding Judge has a duty to exercise a modicum of common sense in deciding how scarce resources are applied. Further, he or she must consider the importance of the issues and any principles of law that might result from a particular ruling. Before any further monetary, legal or judicial resources are applied to this rather unusual and *de-minimis* issue, the instant appeals are dismissed, the underlying convictions reversed, and the three tickets dismissed with prejudice.

Dear Mr Halpin: I am a registered nurse in Newport Vermont. I and a few others are members of a small Occupy affiliated group which has been active in Newport since last fall. We are looking for legal representation in contesting tickets which we received from the City of Newport for writing on the sidewalk in chalk in downtown Newport.

We did a similar event last spring after which we received some positive comments. At that time the mayor responded in a Facebook message to me in which he referred to the chalk as vandalism and said it had "turned off" city council members. He didn't indicate that anyone would be charged with anything. This time a shop owner called the police and the city manager, who came down and took some pictures and washed off the chalk writing within an hour. We heard nothing further for 2 weeks but then my friends received tickets through the Judicial Bureau charging them with Disorderly Conduct. I went to the police station and told them that I was also involved in the event and was given a similar ticket. You can more about it in a news story in the Newport Daily Express from Thursday August 23, or in a Fox 44 Burlington TV story from that evening. The city keeps referring to the chalk as vandalism, though the charge is disorderly conduct. The police chief says he hasn't seen the photos. An officer told one of us that he was asked to arrest us by the city manager, but didn't feel this was appropriate, so we were given the tickets instead. The city manager said in the news story that he doesn't make requests to arrest people but that he had told the police to enforce the vandalism ordinance. (The ticket looks kind of humorous when you read it "Disorderly Conduct-----Writing with chalk on sidewalks") We are of course contesting the tickets. The tickets seem mostly punitive for having views some members of the City Council don't agree with.

I have a job with a decent income and am able to pay for legal council. My friends are retired and disabled respectively. We are in our 50's and 60's. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

### Ordinances of the City of Newport

An Ordinance Pertaining to Disorderly Conduct

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Newport, Vermont as follows:

Section 95 enacted by the City Council on the twelfth day of April 1971 pertaining to disorderly conduct be hereby amended to read as follows:

No person shall:

- (a) disturb or break the peace by begging, behaving in a disorderly manner or using indecent, profane or insulting language or making indecent gestures in or on a public street, or sidewalk or in or about a public place of business, restaurant, store, hotel, or other public places to the annoyance or disturbance of another person; or
- (b) obstruct vehicular traffic, pedestrian traffic, or the free entrance or egress to or from any public or private property.

A violation of a provision of this Ordinance shall constitute a civil offense pursuant to the provisions of 24 VSA Section 1974a and Section 1977 et seq. A civil penalty of not more than \$500.00 may be imposed for a violation of this civil ordinance. The waiver fee of \$50.00 shall be imposed for a first offense. The waiver fee for a second offense will be \$75.00. All subsequent offenses will carry a waiver fee of \$100.00. All waiver fines shall be to the use of the City of Newport.
