INFORMATION FOR PLAINTIFF AND DEFENDANT ABOUT REPRESENTATION BY AN ATTORNEY

Although you may represent yourself at any hearing during these proceedings, you may wish to consult with or be represented by an attorney. If you hire an attorney to represent you, your attorney is required to tell the Court and the other party that they will be representing you. Both parties have the right to receive "notice" before any hearing that the opposing party will be represented by an attorney. The Family Court Rule requires that such notice must be given to the opposing party or their attorney in person, by telephone, or in writing and it must be given far enough in advance of the hearing to permit them to hire an attorney too. If you do not provide such notice to the opposing party, and if the party without an attorney asks, the Court will postpone the hearing for a reasonable time to allow the unrepresented party to obtain an attorney.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR DEFENDANT

At the hearing to be held on the date and time specified on the face of this notice, the Court will decide on whether to issue or deny a final order. After the hearing, an order may be issued, which may remain in effect as long as the Judge decides concerning relief from abuse, possession of the home and custody of the children. If you fail to appear at the hearing, an order may be issued against you granting the Plaintiff's request for relief as the Court deems appropriate.

How to Prepare for Your Relief from Abuse Hearing

Plaintiff's Information:

If you **filed** the request for Relief from Abuse, you are the Plaintiff. You must appear (remotely or in person) for the hearing or your request for a Final Relief from Abuse Order will be dismissed. You must appear even if the defendant has not been served or your case will be dismissed.

An advocate from your local domestic violence agency may be contacted by you in advance. For information regarding an advocate in your area visit this website <https://vtnetwork.org/get-help/> The advocate will probably not be allowed to speak during the hearing.

Defendant's Information:

If you have been **served** with a Temporary Order for Relief from Abuse, or with a Notice of Hearing, you are the Defendant. You must appear (remotely or in person) no later than the time on your notice. This is your opportunity for the Court to hear information from you and your witnesses. If you do not appear, a Final Order may be granted in your absence.

Your ability to hold certain jobs, possess firearms and ammunition, or keep your immigration status may be affected if a Final Order is granted. If you have questions about the federal Gun Control Act or other laws, you may seek legal assistance.

INFORMATION FOR BOTH PARTIES

THINGS TO DO BEFORE THE HEARING:

If you need to get clothes or other personal items from the home before the hearing, and the order allows it, you must make those arrangements directly with law enforcement. Law enforcement may charge for their services.

You might want to talk to or hire a lawyer. The Court does not appoint lawyers in these types of cases but may have information about legal services. If you have a lawyer in an active Family Court case (such as a divorce, child support, or dissolution case), please contact your lawyer before the hearing.

If you wish to have witnesses testify, it is your responsibility to have them appear (remotely or in person) at the hearing.

If you would like an order about parental rights and responsibilities (custody) and parent child contact (visitation) and child support, you may need to file a separate Parentage, Divorce, Separation, or Dissolution case (unless there already is one). If you are married or have a civil union and you would like final orders about property ownership, you may need to file a Divorce, Separation, or Dissolution case. If you are not married or in a civil union and you would like a final order about property ownership, you may need to file a small claims or civil case. The forms are available for all of these case types from the Court Clerk's office or from the Judiciary website (www.vermontjudiciary.org). It would be helpful to file these forms before your hearing.

Any individual with a disability requiring assistance accessing the services, programs, and/or activities at the Courthouse should contact the Clerk's office at the address on the temporary order for further assistance.



HEARING DAY:

You should be prepared for your hearing at the time on the notice. Do not expect to talk to each other before the hearing. In most cases, you will not be allowed to do so. An online video is available to help you get ready.

It is located on our public website at <https://www.vermontjudiciary.org/family/relief-abuse> It may take some time before your case is called. **Please have your paperwork available during the hearing.**

You may want to have paper and a pen to take notes.

OTHER SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS ABOUT REMOTE HEARINGS:

If you object to the remote hearing or are unable to participate: At least five (5) business days *before* the date of the hearing, you must send or bring a written motion or request to the Court that includes a brief explanation for your request.

Remote Hearings are Hearings:

- You should be on time and be respectful just as if you were in the Courtroom.
- Have a clear connection and be in a quiet location.
- You must not interrupt others speaking unless you cannot hear or have legal objection. If you simply disagree with what is being said, make a note to bring up your disagreement when it is your turn.
- You must call back immediately if you are disconnected, if you do not call back the Court may dismiss your motion or issue an order without you.
- You must call in on a separate line from any other participant and you must not use a speaker phone.

- Factors the court may consider include:
 - The court will consider your request
 - whether you have adequate phone or internet access to participate remotely
 - the parties' convenience
 - the type of the hearing
 - whether there is a way for a lawyer to confidentially communicate with a party or witness in a remote hearing
 - whether a participant is incarcerated
 - whether the hearing will involve documents and cross examination
 - whether all parties agree concerning your objection
 - whether the remote hearing will reasonably harm your case

Filing of exhibits or evidence (or other): You must provide a copy to the Court and, if required, send a copy to all the other parties in the case of any proposed exhibits or evidence a least 7 business days *before* the date of your hearing or case manager conference unless otherwise ordered.

All documents exhibits or evidence (such as PDF files) must be submitted as follows:

- *Non-e-filers*: You may email them to Caledonia - All Divisions - CaledoniaEssexUnit@VTCourts.gov or bring them to the Court at the address in the hearing or case manager conference.
- *E-filers*: You must use the VT Odyssey File & Serve program unless an alternate method has been approved.

All digital exhibits or evidence (such as audio, video or high-resolution image files) must be provided to the Court via the Vermont Digital Evidence Portal. If advance notice to other parties is required by the Court or the rules, exhibits can be shared with other parties through VDEP. The judiciary values your feedback about VDEP. - order Defendant to surrender immediately all firearms under the Defendant's ownership, possession, or control to law enforcement.
- order temporary living expenses for the Plaintiff
- order Defendant to return any personal documents in their possession pertaining to Plaintiff and/or child(ren) named above (e.g. immigration documents, birth certificates, and identification cards)
- order temporary possession of vehicle to Plaintiff, provided that Plaintiff:
 - is the owner or joint owner of the vehicle
 - is the primary payor on the vehicle loan
 - has primary possession or control of vehicle
 - has been restricted from using the vehicle by the defendant.
- order Defendant to complete domestic violence accountability program approved by the Council on Domestic Violence.
- order temporary child support
- order Defendant to refrain from cruelly treating the pet(s) of the parties or the pet(s) of the child(ren) named above.

Any such hearing shall be scheduled no more than fourteen (14) days from the date of the request and after notice to the Defendant. If you withdraw your Complaint and a hearing was set, the hearing will be canceled.
